<u>Motes</u>:- 1 This amount does not, strictly speaking, come into operation until the financial year 1930 - 40.

- 2 £41. 17. 10 represents expenses of maintaining settlers while awaiting transport. It could alternatively be charged to "Transport Expenses".
- 3 Assuming that the total amount available for the Provision of Storage Cisterns was spent. The vote is actually believed to have been over-spent.
- 4 The Wireless Set and Operator are on loan from the Native Lands Commission, Gilbert Islands, and it was anticipated that these two items would be met from the Lands Commission Vote, as in the case of the Other Lands Commission officials loaned to the Settlement Scheme.
- 5 This officer is on the strength for reasons in the main not connected with the Scheme. His appointment consequently was not anticipated.
- 6 Largely due to the short notice and speed with which the Scheme had to be inaugrated. The main item (£86.3.6. for condensing plants) was due to the season in which the scheme was commenced, due to political contingencies which could naturally not be foreseen at the time of applying for the Grant.
- 7 Rations would not have been required had it been possible to commence the scheme at the time and in the manner contemplated in the printed Report.
