Huge Fund For State Reclamation

(Continued from Page 1)

When Sinnott returned early in November last year from Oregon, he found that in the estimates for reclamation projects for this year, there was no provision for any new reclamation projects in Oregon despite the fact his flight had made possible funds for the entire reclamation service and he immediately started a fight.

Gets Senators' Aid.

He enlisted the support of Senators McNary and Chamberlain and together they had a conference with Secretary of the Interior Payne. He decided that their contention was correct and that Oregon had not been fairly treated. The result was the following day an additional estimate for \$490,000 was submitted by the director of the reclamation service to the committee on appropriations. This proposition will enable the reclamation service to make a general survey at once and to begin the Benham Falls dam providing for one of the reservoirs for this project. Ultimately this project will call for from \$10,000,000 to \$12,000,000 and the reclamation of 200,000 acres of fertile Oregon soil. Chairman Sinnott said that in addition to the \$400,000 for the Deschutes project, \$467,000 had been provided for the Umatilla project.

Provides For Reservoir.

"This will provide," said Chairman Sinnott, "for the beginning of the construction of the reservoir on McKay creek, a tributary of the Umatilla river. It is expected that this work will cost \$225,000. It is also proposed to build some pipe lines and to line some of the canals which will cost something like \$110,000 according to the reclamation service estimates. The other amounts will be utilized for the correction of seepage and for the operation and maintenance of the project.

"The largest sum to be used for Oregon irrigation is to be for the Klamath project and the total of \$1,213,000 will be utilized in the coming year. A large portion of this sum will be used for the replacement of a timber flume and provides for a canal from Lost river to the land made tillable by the evaporation of Tule Lake. About 20,000 acres will be available here. Two hundred and ten thousand dollars is also to be used for the construction of a reservoir, known as the Horsely on Miller creek, the principal tributary of the Lost river. This reservoir will conserve flood water and prevent further flow in Tule lake, thus accelerating evaporation of the lake and make reclamation of tillable land in the lake bed more rapid. This reservoir will also permit storage of water for Langell valley. Irrigable lands in Langell valley are found on both sides of Lost river and this reservoir would make available water for these lands. This new reservoir will sup-

plement the work of irrigation now made possible by water from Clear lake reservoir already constructed. The balance of the money will be used for constructing a canal system in Langell valley and the development of the system of lateral canals.

Work Under Way

"I am certain that the real progress of reclamation of lands in Oregon is now under way," said Mr. Sinnott, "and I feel certain that there will be uninterrupted progress. I do not think that conditions will ever revert to those indicated in my statement in December to the committee on appropriations when I said: 'Under these estimates the state of Idaho will receive \$4,205,000, \$2,335,000 of that relating to the American falls reservoir; Idaho has contributed to the reclamation fund a little over \$5,000,000, and has already received \$23,000,000. The state of Montana under these estimates to receive \$2,942,000; it has already received \$15,000,000, and has paid into the reclamation fund \$13,000,000. The state of Washington will receive \$3,133,000; it has already received \$14,000,000 plus and has paid into the reclamation funds \$7,000,000. The state of Wyoming under these estimates is to receive \$3,534,000; the state of Wyoming has contributed to the reclamation fund—these figures are all up to June 30, 1919, and are taken from the last annual report \$5,897,300, and has received already \$11,339,315.24. The state of Oregon under these estimates is to receive \$1,680,000, and the state of Oregon has contributed to the reclamation fund \$11,165,112.62, and has had allotted to it, to June 30, 1919, \$5,813,912.57. In view of this discrimination it seems to me that Oregon should receive better treatment than it is contemplated to have it receive under these estimates. Since that time, of course, \$400,000 estimate has been had for the Deschutes project, making a total appropriation for Oregon reclamation, \$2,080,000. I look for constructive and practical development of reclamation projects all through the state of Oregon as rapidly as the funds are available and I believe now there can be no interruption because the funds from the oil leasing bill will always supplement the reclamation, being repaid from projects to make sufficient working capital to carry the various projects to completion."
