

# Start Repairing Boyles Building

Extensive Repairs To Be Made To Building Damaged By Recent Fire

CONTRACT LET TO GILFILLAN COMPANY

Work of making extensive repairs to the Boyle's building, which was seriously damaged in the recent blaze which totally destroyed the St. Cloud building, has been started by the J. Clyde Gilfillan Lumber Company, who recently received the contract for the remodeling of the building.

An entire new west wall is to be put in, the cellar will be excavated to a lower level to conform to the excavation for the new St. Cloud building, which will be started soon and the interior will be remodeled, Mr. Gilfillan stated this morning.

The work is expected to take several months to complete. Work of tearing out the west wall is making progress. According to the building permit issued this week, the cost of the repairs is placed at \$13,500.
